
Seoul, Colored with Autumn Leaves





Seosulla-gil is a road famous for its stone walls and view of Jongmyo Shrine. As you





Haneul Park, located in the downtown area, has always been a popular place to visit

in the autumn. Every year in fall, the park is host to the Silver Grass Festival, and large

crowds flock to the park to watch the sun setting over the silver grass fields. The park

is also home to fields of pink muhly grass, which has taken social media by storm.

Visitors who enter the arboretum by walking along the railway track will be welcomed by themed gardens such as the Five-Color Garden, Wetland Garden, and Wildflower Garden, all of which

Yangjae Citizen's Forest and Yangjaecheon Stream

Yangjae Citizen's Forest, a thick forest of some 70 species of trees, is one of the best places to go to get in the spirit of fall. In addition to its stately trees, the forest is also home to various sports facilities and a history museum, making it a popular attraction among local residents.
