Masters of Liquor

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Nestled in Haebangchon,
a popular centuries-old village in Seoul among artists and tourists,
Yunjudang is a haven for fans of traditional Korean liquor.

The name “Yunjudang” means “Hostess Yun’s liquor house”
but can also mean “masters of liquor.”

During the day, it holds private makgeolli-making classes,
but when the sun begins to set, Yunjudang opens its doors as a restaurant to serve
both traditional liquor and tasty dishes.

Yunjudang holds on
to the age-old Korean
convention of house-
holds making their
own alcohol.

Spirits made at Yunjudang are a product
of nature, made from fine ingredients
found year-round in Korea. The traditional
liquor, makgeolli (rice wine), is made with
ingredients such as flowers and fruit.



Many of those that attend
the makgeolli-making class
fall in love with this historical
liquor and attempt to make
their own at home.

In addition to the one-day
makgeolli-making class,
Yunjudang regularly hosts
private functions, "homebrew
parties," and small concerts.



💡 Fun facts

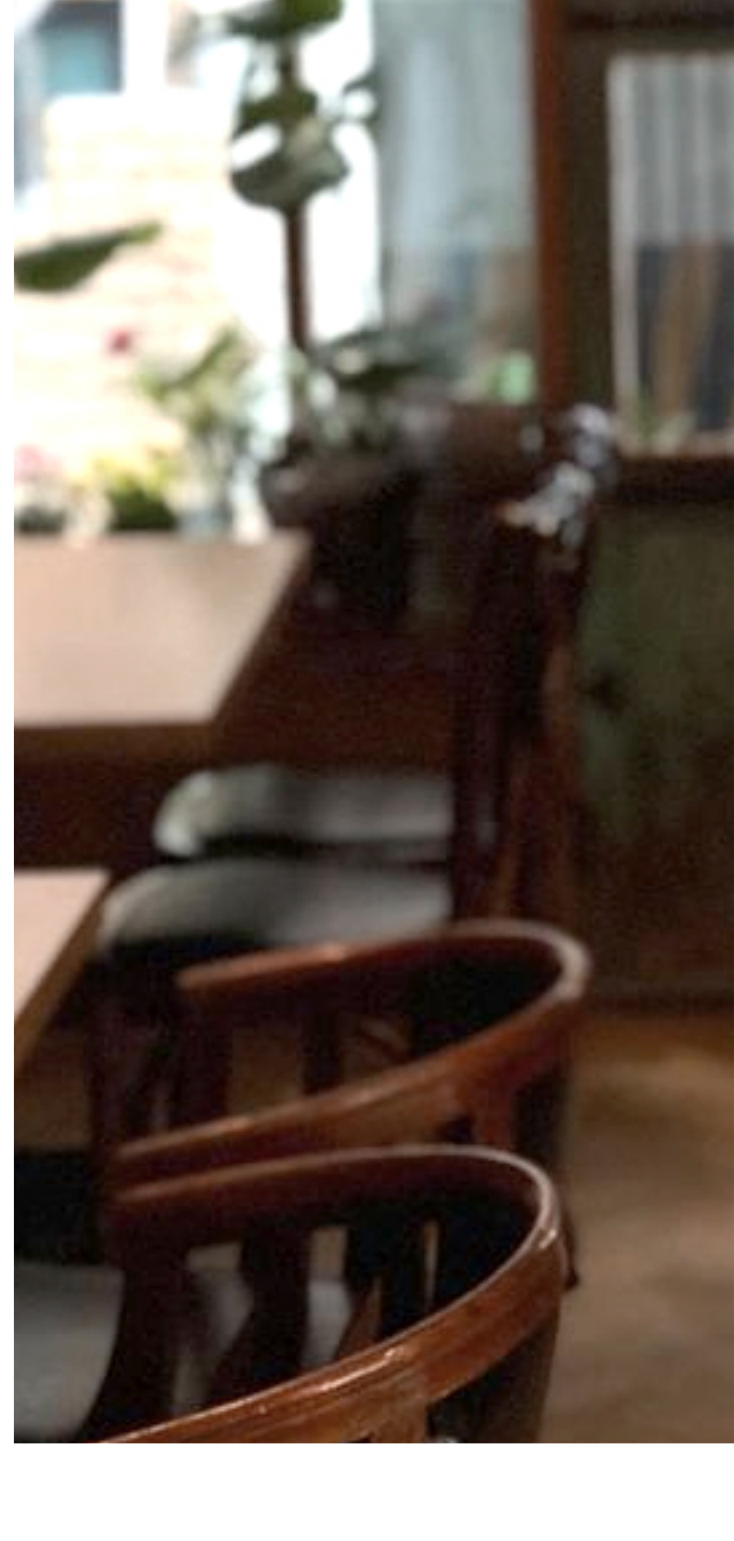
Yunjudang is a traditional, boutique liquor house and one of the “Top 100 Seoul Restaurants and Bars of 2021.” It provides guests with an opportunity to experience traditional Korean culture. For international tourists unable to take makgeolli home with them, Yunjudang offers a special recipe for malt, a key ingredient of makgeolli, so that they can make makgeolli at home.

Haebangchon, where Yunjudang is located, was featured in the Korean TV series Itaewon Class, in which the main character (played by actor Park Seo-joon) opens a street bar in a building just a 10-minute walk from Yunjudang. That establishment is currently a coffee shop, and the evening view of Seoul from the rooftop is a hit with visitors, and is frequently featured on social media.

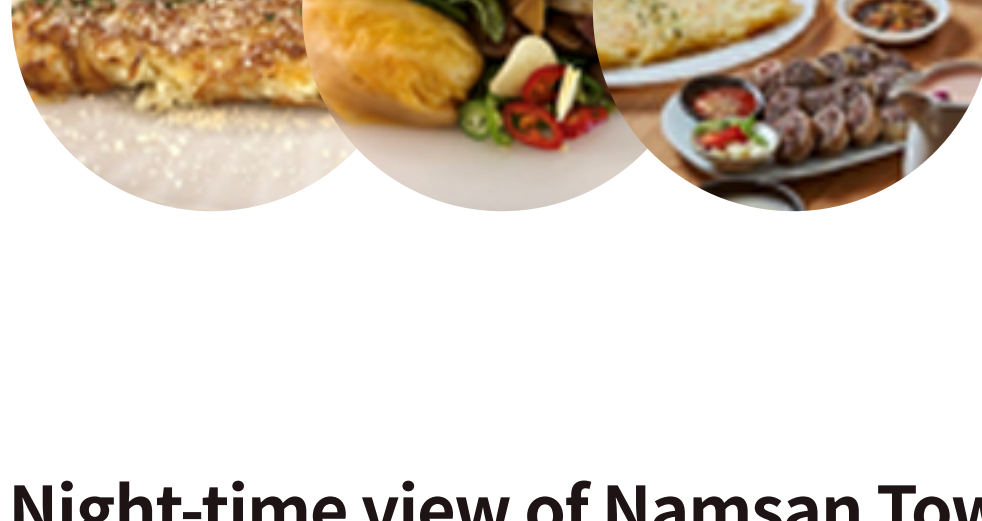
